- The Board will accept comments from the public on each agenda item as it is discussed.

By a majority vote of the Board, these rules may be suspended for special reasons at any particular meeting. Further, the Board may reserve the right to adjust the length of time.

CONSENT GROUP ITEMS

The action of adoption of the "Consent Group" as an official item on the agenda means that all items appearing under the title "Consent Group" shall be adopted by majority approval of a single motion, unless a member of the Board or the Superintendent requests that any particular item be removed from the "Consent Group" and voted on separately.

Generally "Consent Group" items are matters which members of the Board and Superintendent agree are routine in nature and should be acted upon in one motion to conserve time and permit focus on other than routine matters on the agenda.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The group recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

3. PRESENTATION—MATT LEWIS, RESPONSE TO INTERVENTION

Matt Lewis, Elementary Principal, along with Julie Comes, Maggie Hodik, and Gina Armstrong, provided information regarding Response to Intervention (RtI) and the success this program has had in our district.

4. REPORT—STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE

Sydney Stivers, student representative to the Board, was not able to attend this meeting.

5. REPORT—COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD

The Insurance Committee met on Thursday, October 11, 2011, at 6:30 p.m. to continue the discussion on the Health Reimbursement Accounts. The Building and Grounds Committee set a meeting for October 17, 2011 at 7:00 am. The Gainers will meet for a training on November 16, 2011.

6. DISCUSSION—MIKE WATERMAN, TAX LEVIES

Mike Waterman, Business Manager/District Clerk discussed with the Trustees regarding the breakdown of the total tax levies for property owners within the Lewistown city limits. In total, local taxpayers will pay 810.89 mills in the coming year. This total represents an increase of 24.75 mills—approximately 3%—over last year's levels.

7. DISCUSSION—FACILITIES

The Board of Trustees continued the discussion on facilities. At this time projects in process are installing an elevator at the junior high school and replacing the roof on the Lincoln Building. Work is currently being done on the practice football field at Fergus High School to correct the damage caused by the spring flooding.

8. CALENDAR ITEMS, CONCERNS, CORRESPONDENCE, ETC.

No items were discussed.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

9. OTHER ITEMS

Jason Butcher, Superintendent, discussed with the Trustees regarding the October Fall Enrollment count; the sale of the Construction Academy House; a reminder of the MCEL dates and timelines; and schedules for the Board Tours and 2011 Roundtable sessions. The Board also reviewed dates for upcoming District events. The Board also discussed grant opportunities and the possibility of utilizing an outside agency to help research grants available for school districts. The Board consented to have the District buy into a grant-finding website.

Board Meetings

Regular Meetings

Unless otherwise specified, all meetings will be held in the Lincoln Board Room, 215 7th Avenue South, Lewistown, Montana. Regular meetings shall be held at 7:00 p.m. on the second and fourth Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. September through May and at 5:30 p.m. June-August., with the exception of July and December, when the Board has one (1) meeting, or at other times and places determined by a majority vote. Except for an unforeseen emergency, meetings must be held in a school building or in a publicly owned building located within the District. If regular meetings are to be held at places other than the place stated above or are adjourned to times other than the regular meeting time, notice of the meeting shall be made in the same manner as provided for special meetings.

Emergency Meetings

In the event of an emergency involving possible personal injury or property damage, the Board may meet immediately and take official action without prior notification.

Budget Meetings

Between July 1st and August 4th of each year, the Clerk shall publish a notice stating the date, time, and place the trustees will meet for the purpose of considering and adopting the final budget of the District, stating that the meeting of the trustees may be continued from day to day until the final adoption of the District's budget, and stating that any taxpayer in the District may appear at the meeting and be heard for or against any part of the budget. This notice shall be published in the *Lewistown News-Argus*.

On the date and at the time and place stated in the published notice (on or before August 15th), the trustees shall meet to consider all budget information and any attachments required by law. The meeting may continue from day to day; however, the Board must adopt the final budget not later than the fourth (4th) Monday in August.

Special Meetings

Special meetings may be called by the Chairman or by any two (2) trustees. A written notice of a special meeting, stating the purpose of the meeting, shall be delivered to each trustee not less than forty-eight (48) hours prior to the time of the meeting. Such written notice shall be posted

conspicuously within the District in a manner that will receive public attention. Written notice shall also be sent not less than twenty-four (24) hours prior to the meeting, to each newspaper and radio or television station that has filed a written request for such notices. **Business transacted at a special meeting will be limited to that stated in the notice of the meeting**.

Executive Sessions

Under Montana law, the Board may hold closed or executive sessions to consider matters of individual privacy. Prior to closing the meeting, the presiding officer must determine that the demands of individual privacy exceed the merits of public disclosure. The Board may also close a meeting to discuss a strategy to be followed with respect to litigation, when an open meeting would have a detrimental effect on the litigating position of the District. This exception does not apply if the litigation involves only public bodies or associations as parties. Prior to closing a meeting for this purpose, it is recommended that the District obtain legal advice on the appropriateness of this action. No formal action shall take place during executive session.
