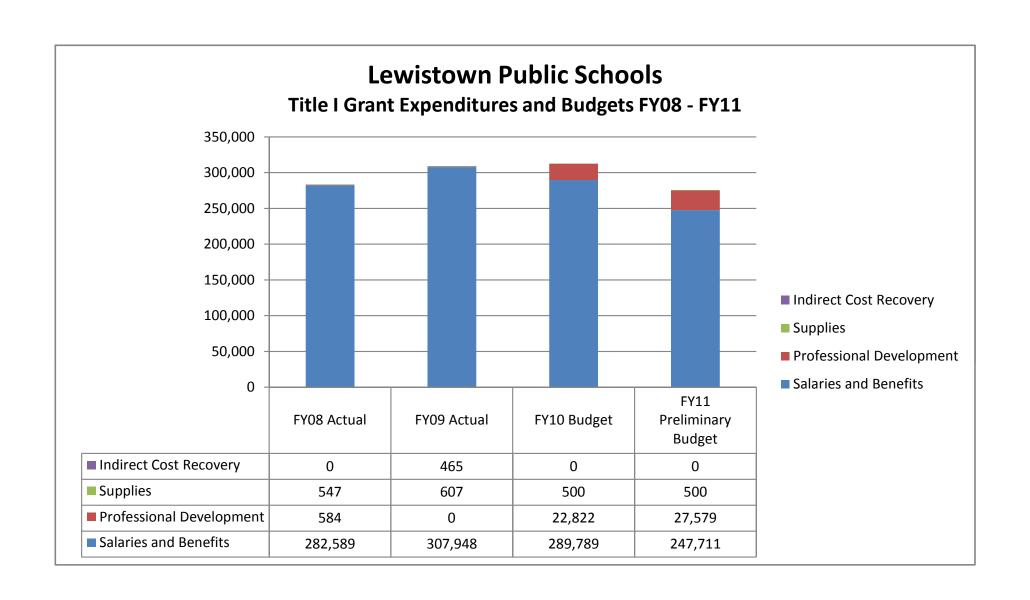

As mentioned at the November 9 Board meeting, the Board may wish to consider the impacts of a potential bond issue in relation to the whole picture of local property taxes. Several significant events will affect the mills the Lewistown School District levies over the next 20 years. Illustrated by the accompanying graphs, these events include:

- The District is currently levying \$250,000 per year in anticipation of building a new bus barn. At the end of this fiscal year, we will have accumulated close to \$600,000 for this estimated \$1.25 million project. After the District raises the money needed to relocate the bus barn, the roughly 20-mill levy used for this purpose will presumably cease.
- In 2005, Lewistown voters authorized 10-year, \$980,000 building reserve levies in both the Elementary and the High School. That levy authority will expire after FY2015, saving taxpayers approximately 16 mills. Note that the existing building reserve cannot be extended; however, voters can approve another building reserve levy at any time.
- Our new QZAB bond has an eight-year term and will be completely repaid in 2017. Beginning in 2018, then, taxpayers will save the roughly 10 mills currently levied for debt service.
- Repayment of the QZAB will also simultaneously free up the state subsidy, which can then be applied toward the new bond. At that time, the levy for the new \$10 million bond will drop to roughly 48 mills—a 20% decrease.

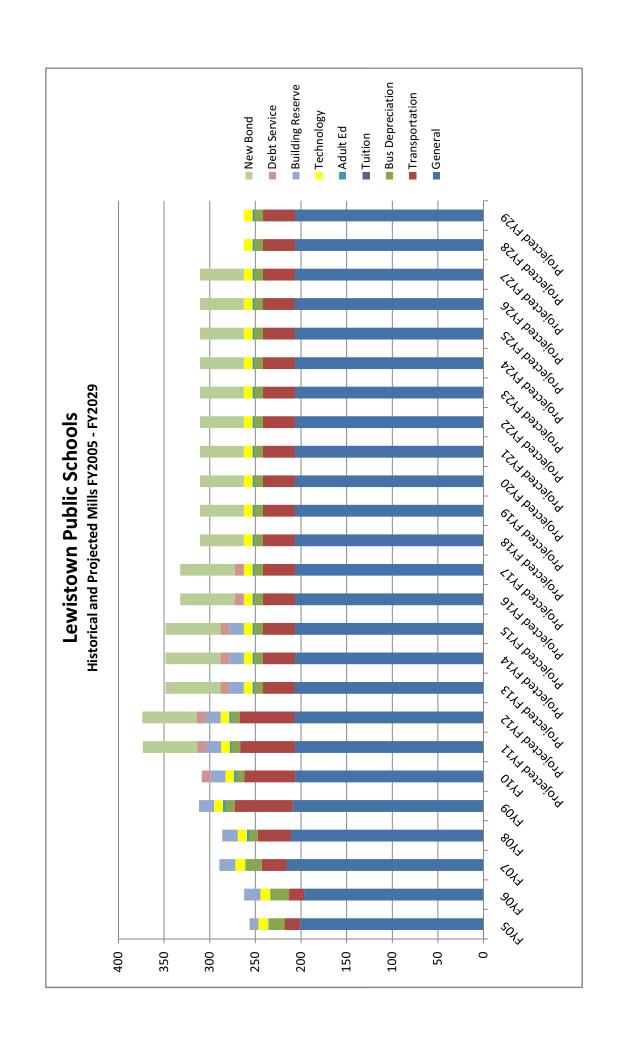
Although neither certain nor quantifiable at this point, the operational savings of some of the options might also enable us to forego operating levies. Doing so would obviously provide even more savings to the taxpayer.

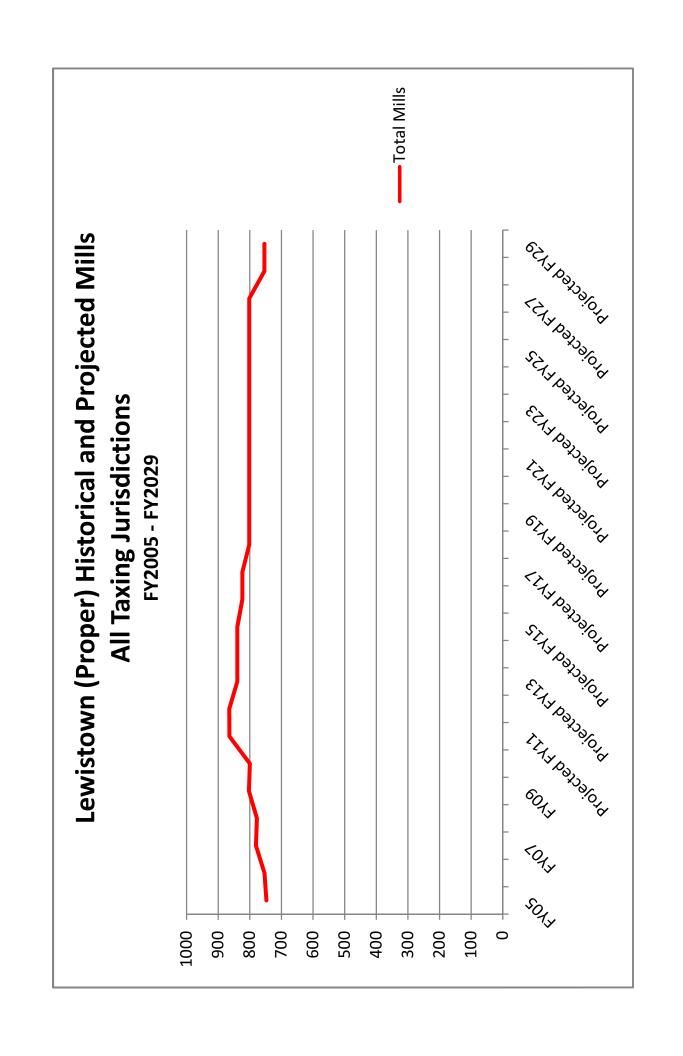
These graphs contain many assumptions, all of which are subject to debate. Some of the most noteworthy include:

- Mills levied in support of the city and county will remain constant at current levels.
- No increase in mills levied to support our General and Transportation Funds.
- Passage of a \$10 million project would increase taxes between 50-65 mills, depending on the interest rate. For purposes of this example, I assumed the bond would cost 60 mills. Note that many of the options discussed will cost more than the \$10 million. If additional amounts are spent, the mills graph would have to be adjusted accordingly.
- Constant mill value.
- No consideration given for interest earned on sinking fund.

No decisions were made but the committee plans to convene again before the next regular meeting of the Board to consider the issues. It was also noted that the Collective Gaining Committee will start meeting on November 10, 2009.

REPORT -COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD

No items were discussed.

CALENDAR ITEMS

The Board recognized Dave Pillar, manager of the local Pamida Discount Center, store clerks and customers for donating \$635.00 to the school district to help cover the cost of student supplies.

RECOGNITION -PAMIDA FOUNDATION

Superintendent Jason Butcher facilitated discussion regarding the survey results and information received on school district facilities. Charlie Brown, who is a member of the Facility Steering Committee, provided an overview of the committee's work. DISCUSSION -FACILITIES REVIEW

Trustee Stan Monger asked if the committee had considered adding a middle school wing to Fergus High School. Committee members stated it hadn't been considered specifically; however, they expressed some preliminary concerns with the concept.

Chairman Dave Byerly inquired as to if the committee felt the voting public would support a proposition. Committee members responded by suggesting the question be framed as a daily or monthly cost rather than a project total. They also noted that they felt that the concept of a new junior high building was the wisest use of taxpayer dollars.

The committee and trustees examined the merits of adding grades to both Lewis & Clark Elementary School and Fergus High School.

Representatives from JGA Architects estimated costs for a new facility at \$180.00 per square foot. Many of the expenses are dependent upon site and utility work that must be done to a chosen building location. Equipment costs would also add to that total.

The Board and committee continued to discuss aspects of various options.

DISCUSSION
CONTINUED FACILITIES
REVIEW

Each member of the Board spoke regarding what he or she thought was the next step to be taken. Trustee Jeremy Bristol felt that the school district should proceed with plans for a new junior high building/bus barn/administration complex. Trustees Stan Monger, Mary Schelle, and Monte Weeden noted that they would like to see more information on a new junior high building/bus barn/administration complex. Trustees Becky Jackson and Jennifer Granot asked for more details on a new junior high building/bus barn/administration complex and adding onto Fergus High School. Chairman Dave Byerly stated he would like more information on adding a classroom and gym space for one additional grade at Lewis & Clark Elementary School, and to address high priority repairs and upgrades as a fallback position. Trustee Mary Schelle disagreed with that option noting the Board needs to focus on its favorite choice rather than continue to consider multiple alternatives.

Zane Fulbright stated that he felt the survey results received were significant and reliable. He also thought the Board's consensus to proceed with constructing a new building was not consistent with the feedback from the community.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:45 p.m. The next regular meeting will be held on November 23, 2009, at 7:00 p.m. in the Lewis & Clark Elementary School Gymnasium (Jackson - unanimous).

#### 2009-2010 GOALS AND STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES

Lewistown Public Schools, as entrusted by the Lewistown Community, provides children with an accountable, high quality, rigorous education in a safe, nurturing environment; developing the full potential of each child and preparing them for lifelong success in their personal lives and careers, wherever they may be in the world.

Statement of Intended Outcome, 2009-2010: Lewistown Public Schools has developed an outstanding educational program that ensures that every student achieves the highest academic performance possible and has multiple opportunities to actively participate in both co-curricular and extra-curricular activities offered by our District. Our staff is highly supporting and enthusiastic about our differentiated approach to instruction.

#### Strategic Objectives:

- 2. Conclude by February 28, 2010, a feasibility study about how to get out of the Lincoln Building, secondary to results of the Facility Study and Plan.

#### Strategic Objectives:

- 1. Obtain data on parent use of Infinite Campus portal and utilize data to increase usage.
- 2. Implement steps to reach out to the community (don't wait for people to come to us), such as: visiting local coffee clubs, radio programs, newspaper articles and columns/opinions (from staff, administrators and trustees).
- 3. Assess our efforts to reach out to the community including steps taken during 2008-2009 and fine tune and improve for 2009-2010.

#### Goal Area 4: Technology

We have successfully incorporated technology into our facilities and all aspects of our educational program in a methodical and effective manner that prepares our students for the real world. We have systems in place to ensure the safety of our students and compliance with District standards.

#### Strategic Objectives:

- 1. Keep technology infrastructure current and sound (routers, switchers, servers, internet service and work stations). Continue to prevent problems and keep technology accessible (security, filtering, preventative updates).
- 2. Develop a plan to insure that we are investigating and, wherever necessary and affordable, implementing new technologies for cost-efficient delivery of technology for students and staff (such as expanding terminal services, implementing virtualization, proven open-source software solutions).

- 7. Determine if and how the district should help educate parents about the ways their children use technology (in and out of school, for good and bad reasons).
- 8. Develop a timeline on researching, understanding and implementing a plan to leverage social networking and other technology to support better teaching and learning by expanding student-to-student and student-to-faculty connections for collaborating beyond the classroom.

#### Goal Area 5: Highly Qualified Staff

Statement of Intended Outcome, 2009-2010: Lewistown Public Schools has developed a recruitment and retention program to ensure that the District hires and retains high quality, effective personnel. Our teachers and other staff have been provided professional development opportunities that directly correlate to the high academic standards set by the District. Our teachers and other staff have embraced the use of technology into all aspects of our educational programs.
